
INVESTMENT STRATEGY

- The fund is a total return credit strategy that primarily invests in structured products including:
 - Agency and Non-Agency Residential Mortgage-Backed Securities (RMBS)
 - Mortgage derivatives - Interest Only (IO), Principal Only (PO), and Inverse Interest Only (IIO) securities
 - Commercial Mortgage-Backed Securities (CMBS)
 - Collateralized Loan Obligations (CLO)
 - Asset-Backed Securities (ABS)
- The fund aims to deliver strong absolute and relative returns in an esoteric asset class that provides complementary diversification benefits to core fixed income portfolios.
- The portfolio manager utilizes bottom-up, credit-intensive research to drive security selection from a wide range of credits and issuer types.

NET TOTAL RETURNS AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2020









The fund's benchmark for performance comparison purposes is the Bloomberg Barclays US Aggregate Bond Index. The index is an unmanaged index that measures the investment grade, US dollar-denominated, fixed-rate taxable bond market. The index includes Treasuries, government-related and corporate securities, mortgage pass-through securities, and asset-backed securities. The table reflects the theoretical reinvestment of dividends on securities in the index. The impact of any transaction costs and the deduction of expenses associated with a mutual fund, such as investment management and administration fees, are not reflected in the index calculations. It is not possible to invest directly in an index.

*River Canyon Fund Management LLC (the "Adviser") has contractually agreed to waive fees and reimburse expenses to the extent that Total Annual Fund Operating Expenses (excluding brokerage costs, interest, taxes, dividend expense on short positions, litigation and indemnification expenses, expenses associated with investments in underlying investment companies, and extraordinary expenses) exceed 0.65% until January 28, 2021. The Net Expense Ratio is .70% as of December 31, 2020.

Duration is a calculation of the average life of a bond (or portfolio of bonds) that is a useful measure of the bond's price sensitivity to interest rate changes. The higher the duration number, the greater the risk and reward potential of the bond.

Volatility represents standard deviation, a statistical measure of distribution around an average, which depicts how widely returns varied over a certain period of time. When a fund has a high standard deviation, the predicted range of performance is wide, implying greater volatility.

Sharpe Ratio is a measure that uses standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. The greater a fund's Sharpe ratio, the better its risk-adjusted performance has been.

Information Ratio is a ratio of portfolio returns above the returns of a benchmark - usually an index - to the volatility of those returns. It measures a portfolio manager's ability to generate excess returns relative to a benchmark but also attempts to identify the consistency of the investor.

Sortino Ratio is a variation of the Sharpe ratio. It removes the effects of upward price movements to measure only return against downside price volatility.

It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns.
