Notable Observations

Cash: Increased our cash allocation in the portfolio to reflect a more defensive position in the face of rising rates and broader fixed income disruptions. While interest rates have risen dramatically we do not believe credit spreads have adjusted to reflect the increased chance of recession.

RMBS – Agency: Largest contributor to portfolio returns this month. We monetized profits on some of our Interest-Only mortgage derivatives as they benefitted from rising rates in Q1.

ABS: Aircraft ABS with exposure to Russia was the largest detractor in the portfolio this month. We reduced exposure in tranches most impacted by reduced collateral coverage where planes were seized by the Russian government.

CMBS: Exited some of our single-asset single-borrower senior tranches. Generally still very comfortable with the quality of the collateral in these securitizations but they have outperformed the disruption in broader credit markets and we will look to deploy into better total return opportunities elsewhere.

CLO 2.0: Floating rate bank loan products continued to perform well relative to broader fixed income drawdowns with duration and interest rate exposure. That being said, we took down exposure here as well given credit spreads have not priced in higher chances of a recession.

With \$867.0 million in AUM as of Q1 2022, the Fund is an actively managed, diversified portfolio of structured credit and other fixed income instruments. The Fund strives to achieve high relative and risk-adjusted returns compared to the Bloomberg US Aggregate Bond Index (BAGG).

River Canyon Fund Management LLC (the "Adviser") has contractually agreed to waive fees and reimburse expenses to the extent that Total Annual Fund Operating Expenses (excluding brokerage costs, interest, taxes, dividend expense on short positions, litigation and indemnification expenses, expenses associated with investments in underlying investment companies, and extraordinary expenses) exceed 0.65% until January 28, 2023. The current gross expense ratio is 0.89% and the net expense ratio is 0.67%.





It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Morningstar rankings are based on a fund's average annual total return relative to all funds in the same Morningstar category. Fund performance used within the rankings, reflects certain fee waivers, without which, returns and Morningstar rankings would have been lower. Morningstar's percentile ranking is based on the highest (or most favorable) rank of 1 and the lowest (or least favorable) percentile rank of 100.

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
